Though the average person can go three days without water, physicians report that most people go through each day mildly dehydrated. When we don't drink enough water, our lives will reflect that reality. We develop headaches, may grow dizzy or feel fatigued, and can have difficulty thinking or concentrating - all as results of lacking water. These truths lead us to a conclusion that no one would argue against: we have a continued need for water; our bodies require it to survive.

But just as we experience physical thirst, we can also struggle along in a state of spiritual dehydration, and just as we need a continual supply of water to survive, we also require a sustained source of spiritual refreshing to live.

I was reminded of this lately when I was reading about the Feast of Tabernacles. Israel has celebrated this annual feast since its beginning in the Old Testament. The celebration is in remembrance of the way that God provided for the Israelites as they wandered through the desert after being brought out of bondage in Egypt. The feast also took place at the time of the year when the rainy season was about to begin. All eyes were upon the skies as the anticipation built for the life-giving rain. Throughout the feast, water was poured from a golden pitcher into a basin in the court of the Jewish Temple. This water symbolized the providence of God and reminded Israel of their dependence upon the LORD for survival and sustenance in the nation's past and present. In addition to praising God for providing for the physical needs of his people, the feast also looked forward to the coming of the promised Messiah who would bring enduring spiritual change. On the last day of the feast, the celebration surrounding the water-pouring ceremony was more elaborate than any of the previous days. Everyone was focused upon the beginning of the rainy season and the promise of the one who would be sent by God as the great Deliverer, the one who was the fulfillment of the thirst for eternal provision.

It was at this moment that the promised Deliverer spoke.

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water'" (John 7:37-38).

The people celebrating the feast were asking for and eagerly awaiting the provision of God, and God himself was in their midst to answer. Jesus was saying, "You're anticipating the Messiah? I am that one—the only one who can meet your deepest level of spiritual thirst."

Like Israel, we all face the moment-to-moment choice as to how we quench our spiritual thirst. We can rely completely upon Christ and trust that he gives "a spring of water welling up to eternal life" (John 4:14). Or we can try to meet our thirst by our own power and make "broken cisterns that can hold no water" (Jeremiah 2:13).

Maybe the skies in your life have been cloudless and stark recently, and perhaps the rains have not come as you have anticipated that they would. Maybe, like parched ground, you're just thirsty and dry. If so, remember the words of Jesus: "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink..."
