Chapter 9 - Israel's past election, Chapter 10 - Israel's present rejection, Chapter 11 - Israel's future restoration

Sovereignty is generally defined as "the absolute rule over an area" or "being free from any external control." When applied to God, we can say that sovereignty is "the right of **God to do as He wishes (Ps. 50:1; Is. 40:15; 1 Tim. 6:15) with His creation. This implies that there is no external influence upon Him and that He also has the ability to exercise** His right according to His will."

God's sovereignty and human responsibility:

God chose the progression of the line of Israel (9:6-23)

Though He chose, God...

- Is still fair (9:14)
- Is still merciful (9:15,16)
- Has a perfect purpose (9:17-23)

God hardened Pharaoh's heart" (Ex. 4:21; 7:3; 9:12; 10:1, 20, 27; 11:10; 14:4, 8, 17)

Pharaoh hardened his own heart (Ex. 7:13, 14, 22; 8:15, 19, 32; 9:7, 34, 35; 13:15)

Ezek. 33:11; 2 Pet. 3:9

God chose to include the Gentiles in His Kingdom (9:24-33)

1 Cor. 1:22-23

Israel depended upon the law, not faith, for righteousness (10:1-18)

God chose to use the Gentiles to provoke Israel to jealousy (10:19-21)

God has not rejected Israel entirely but has partially hardened them (11:1-8)

God's reasons in His choices are ultimately for redemption (11:9-32)

God's ways are beyond our understanding (11:33-36)
